ADVISOR OF THE MONTH – TAL BLACK



Tal Black, New Voices Advisor of the Month, is the recently retired Associate Director of the National Early Childhood Technical Assistance Center (NECTAC) at the Frank Porter Graham Child Development Institute at UNC-Chapel Hill.

Tal has been President of the Division of Early Childhood of the National Council for Exceptional Children and has played a major role nationally in the establishment of early childhood education and intervention programs. He received his graduate education in child development at George Peabody College of Vanderbilt University.
