2015 was a busy year for New Voices. Don and I would like to share some of New Voice's accomplishments from this year.

New Voices made grants to two school systems to provide additional assessment tools and materials for fine motor development. The therapist and teacher were grateful to New Voices for making their jobs more efficient and improving the education of students.

In April, New Voices recognized three outstanding professionals with Lara Jane Parker Awards. New Voices also provided scholarships to 14 professionals to develop their skills to better serve New Voices children. In turn, they shared what they learned across their school districts.

In October, New Voices visited with Merck employees and demonstrated the equipment used by New Voices children. New Voices also met and answered questions from students from area universities who had just watched Certain Proof offering these students a different perspective of New Voices children.

New Voices advocates for children with complex communication needs and mobility issues by working with other like-minded organizations like the NC Assistive Technology Program and the Wake Special Education Advisory Council. Having a seat at the table ensures New Voices children are represented at statewide conferences and at local family resource fairs.

Starting this year, New Voices is publishing monthly newsletters. New Voices has also increased our presence on social media, bringing posts about education, communication, equipment, and personal experiences to our growing audience. 



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
